Education & Empowerment of Children and Youth

CHILDLINE-1098 Sub-Centre, Sirsi: Project under Women & Child Development Department:

CHILDLINE 1098 is a national, 24 hour, free, emergency phone and outreach service for children in need of care and protection, linking them to long term rehabilitation. CHILDLINE India Foundation (CIF) provides the toll free phone service across India, monitoring the delivery of the service to the callers, financing the operation and training of personnel in order to provide relief and rehabilitation to children in distress.

Our organization has been selected for the CHILD LINE-1098 project on 27th December 2017 to set up the CHILDLINE sub-centre unit in Uttara Kannada (Karwar) district, Karnataka State. 311 cases of distressed children registered in Uttara Kannada district and immediate care and protection provided.



Women Empowerment & Gender Equity

Formation and Strengthening of SHGs

Women are organized in Self-Help Groups. They are provided various trainings for the capacity building and gender equity. Capacity development

trainings on leadership skills have been conducted for the members of SHGs. Orientation on legal literacy & various skill development workshops were organized to SHG members & at the same time Income Generation Activity trainings were taken up on various skills. SHG members are empowered to establish business and enterprising ventures for making their livelihood on sustainable basis. Financial

support in the form of loan is provided by NABFINS & ICICI to start small commercial setup of their own choice.



We have formed over 2300 women's Self-Help Groups (SHGs) in three districts, to economically empower marginalised rural women. At the SHGs, we run various vocational training courses, like Tailoring, Fashion designing, Bag Making, Beautician and Dairy Farming. Apart from training and preparing women for jobs or self-employment, we also support them through credit linkage. The combined micro-credit lending across our SHGs has crossed Rs. 99.37 crores so far.

Santvana Mahila Kendra

Counseling for the victims of domestic violence & to provide legal assistance, temporary shelter, financial relief, training and rehabilitation to women who are victims of various atrocities such as dowry, rape, sexual harassment, domestic violence etc. Santvana centre is provided with a toll free number 1091. The helpline receives calls from women in distress round the clock. Facilities and rehabilitative services are provided to such women as per the recommendations of the District Level Committee depending on the merits of the case. Santvana Mahila Kendra started from February 2015, at Haliyal taluk, Uttara Kannada district

Health, Sanitation & Environment

SCODWES have implemented 04 Mobile Medical Unit from June 2016, under national Health Mission & SCP & TSP, Dept. of Health & Family Welfare, Mobile Medical Unit implemented at Mayakonda, Jaglur, Kudligi and Sandur of Davanger and Ballari taluk of Davangere & Ballari district, under which the allotted villages & nearly 90 villages have been provided with primary medical services.

SCODWES have implemented 04 Mobile Medical Unit from November 2016, under national Health Mission Dept. of Health & Family Welfare, Mobile Medical Unit implemented at Sirsi, Yellapur, Ankola and Joida of Uttara Kannada district, under which the allotted villages & nearly 80 villages have been provided with primary medical services.

Operation of Public Health Centre, Mallapur, Karwar & Operation of Mobile Medical Health Unit for the villages around 16 kms from Kaiga Generating Station) (Sponsored by Nuclear Power Corporation of India Limited – NPCIL). From 16th November implemented Operation of Public Health Centre, Mallapur, Karwar

The objectives of the scheme are as under:

- (1) To improve health care access to villagers residing within the 16 Kms radius of Kaiga Site.
- (2) To create awareness on improving health through counselling on various related issues.
- (3) To promote institutional deliveries as against home deliveries to avoid and eliminate maternal delivery deaths / infant deaths

KARNATAKA ROAD DEVELOPMENT CORPORATION LTD RAP -II

The Second Karnataka Highway Project is under implementation and “Co-Financing Works” is one of the components of the project to be implemented by Karnataka Road Development Corporation (KRDCL). This co-financing component includes widening and strengthening of 180.15 consisting of 3 roads spread across the state. This component is aimed in modernizing highway-financing through leveraging funding from financial institutions and banks.

In this background, From November 2014 SCODWES has been selected for the implementation of the project at North Karnataka. In North Karnataka there are 3 link roads. Road No. 01 from Bagewadi (NH-4)-Bailhongal – Saundatti, Road No. 02 from Bidar-NH-9 (Ekhelli)- Chincholi & Road No.07 from Hungund - Muddebihal -Talikot

This Resettlement Action Plan (RAP) is prepared to cover the land acquisition and resettlement impacts resulting due to improvements to the above roads. The objective of this RAP is to:

- To present the adverse impacts associated with land acquisition and loss of other assets with the implementation of Project;
- To present the Entitlements for the affected persons for payment of compensation and assistance for establishing the livelihoods and;
- To present an action plan for the delivery of compensation and assistance in accordance with the policy adopted for the project.
